The show and tell calendar came home in your child's Friday Folder today. Please note that we are starting our Estimation Jar in November. I have in-

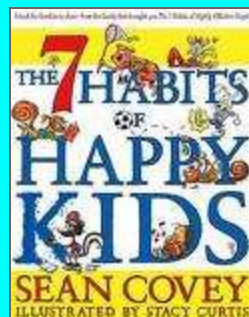
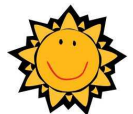
cluded a note in the Friday Folder with an explanation of this activity.
